

Brief College Profiles: Click on the underlined links to go directly to the college website. Note on interpreting the AVG SAT and AVG ACT column. Example: Math 480 / 620 The lower number (480) is the 25th percentile of students who *enrolled* in (not just applied to) the college received a math score of 480 or lower. The upper number (620) is 75th percentile of students who *enrolled* in the college. 75% of enrolled students received a math score of 620 or lower; looked at another way 25% of students received above a 620. So for example if you received a math score of 640 you would be in the top 25% of applicants for that measure. NR = Not reported

*CWU, EWU and The Evergreen State College use the **admissions index (AI)** to automatically admit students who meet their minimum admissions level. The admissions index system is a formula that weights grade point average (GPA) 2/3 and SAT/ACT score 1/3 to assign an AI number. Applications from students with lower than minimum admission index number receive a comprehensive review.

Community & Technical College Applications

Community colleges offer Associate Degrees for Transfer to baccalaureate colleges and Associated Degrees and Certificates in various occupational programs. Technical colleges offer Associate Degrees and Certificates in occupational programs. Some programs have prerequisites and/or waiting lists. It is generally recommended that applications be submitted by January of the senior year; however, some programs recommend earlier applications. Students must have a high school diploma or be 18 years old to attend community and technical colleges and will take a placement test in language arts and math prior to admissions to determine whether they will begin courses at a college or remedial (high school) level. Consult the schools directly for their deadlines, enrollment, and placement test procedures.
